Economic Measures	<ul style="list-style-type: none">The UAE's banking sector is expected to face a bumpy ride into the third quarter with the second quarter earnings reflecting the impact of the coronavirus on asset growth, asset quality and profitability. (Link)
Health & Safety	<ul style="list-style-type: none">On June 29, the UAE saw 421 new cases (-6.2% from the previous day) of the coronavirus, bringing the total to 48,667 total confirmed cases. (Link)The Abu Dhabi Department of Health has confirmed that all Al Dhafra Hospitals are completely free of coronavirus cases. (Link)Sheikh Khalifa Specialty Hospital in Ras Al Khaimah has no patients with confirmed coronavirus cases. (Link)
Travel	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Emirates Airlines has added four destinations to its passenger schedule in July – Cairo, Tunis, Glasgow and Male. (Link)UAE has suspended receiving passengers from Pakistan as of June 29 over coronavirus fears. (Link)
Daily Life	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Places of worship to reopen in the UAE as of July 1. (Link)Ras Al Khaimah Government offices will resume work with 100 percent capacity from Sunday July 5. (Link)Ajman government offices to resume work with 75 percent staff from July 1. (Link)Entry to Abu Dhabi is permitted for those who received a negative COVID-19 test within the previous 48 hours. (Link)Dubai residents planning to return to the emirate must have government approval to re-enter and are required to show a negative COVID-19 test received in the previous 72 hours. (Link)
