Good evening! This is Akin Gump's <u>weekly policy newsletter</u> on all things **climate change**. Below are the major federal climate policy headlines of the past week:

- Biden Administration Launches \$3 Billion Plan for Electric Car Batteries
 On Monday, May 2nd, the U.S. Department of Energy announced the launch of two Bipartisan Infrastructure Law programs that will provide \$3.16 billion in funding to advance domestic battery manufacturing and recycling and second-life applications for batteries used to power electric vehicles. The "Battery Materials Processing and Battery Manufacturing" and "Electric Drive Vehicle Battery Recycling and Second Life Applications" funding opportunities were issued by the Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy (EERE) and both have application submission deadlines in July.
- Manchin Convenes Bipartisan Talks on Climate and Energy Legislation (E&E News)

Last week, Senate Energy and Natural Resources Chairman Joe Manchin (D-WV) met with a group of bipartisan Senators to discuss a new climate and energy legislative package building upon the stalled *Build Back Better Act*. Attendees of the meeting included Sen. Lisa Murkowski (R-AK), Sen. Kevin Cramer (R-ND), Sen. Tom Carper (D-DE), and Sen. Mark Kelly (D-AZ).
