Good afternoon!

This is Akin's newsletter on climate change policy and regulatory developments, providing information on major climate policy headlines from the past week and forthcoming climate-related events and hearings:

National

• Biden: New Climate Report Shows Urgency of Threat (E&E News)

Upon the release of the fifth National Climate Assessment—which illustrates how climate change impacts Americans and the country's economy—President Biden stressed that "the report sounds a dire warning about inaction on combating the climate crisis."

• Polluting Industries Say the Cost of Cleaner Air is Too High (New York Times)

With the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) slated to announce regulations regarding soot, industries are "warning of dire economic consequences" as "a coalition [...] including mining, oil and gas, manufacturing, and timber sent a letter to the White House Chief of Staff."

• The Coming Senate Energy, Environment Committee Shuffle (E&E News)

With the retirements of Sens. Joe Manchin (D-WV) and Tom Carper (D-DE), chairs of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources and Environment and Public Works committees, respectively, lawmakers, staffers and lobbyists alike expect Sens. Martin Heinrich (D-NM) and Sheldon Whitehouse (D-RI) to "be fresh Democratic faces at the top of the two Senate committees."

• Wicker Withdraws Support for GOP Carbon Tariff Bill (E&E News)

Sen. Roger Wicker (R-MS)—"one of three Republican backers of new legislation tying trade policy to emissions reduction goals"—withdrew his support for Sen. Bill Cassidy's (R-LA) *Foreign Pollution Fee Act*.

State and Local

• Regional Greenhouse Gas Trading Program Faces Political Challenges (Politico)

With Virginia Democrats' freshly reclaimed majority, pushback to "Gov. Glenn Youngkin's [(R-VA)] effort to pull his state out of the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative [(RGGI)]" is anticipated. Meanwhile, Gov. Josh Shapiro (D-PA) "must decide whether to continue his predecessor's efforts to

join the program Shapiro himself has been noticeable cool toward after a court barred the state's participation last week."

• First U.S. Direct Air Capture Plant Opens in California (E&E News)

Heirloom Carbon Technologies welcomed the first commercial direct air capture facility in the United States in Tracy, California. The facility "will be capable of removing 1,000 tons of carbon dioxide from the atmosphere per year."

• Michigan Just Passed One of the Country's Most Ambitious Clean Energy Bills (Canary Media)

Michigan's Democrat-controlled legislature greenlit several clean energy bills, including a measure that would "order the state's two biggest investor-owned utilities, Consumers Energy and DTE energy, to undertake a course to reach 80 percent carbon-free electricity sales by 2035 and 100 percent carbon-free energy by 2040."

International

• China's Methane Pledge Signals Warming Diplomacy Ahead of COP28 (E&E News)

China issued its long-anticipated plan to slash its methane emissions, "a move that analysts said could lead to increase cooperation between the United States and China." The plan was agreed to at the Conference of Parties (COP) hosted in Glasgow, Scotland, but its release was delayed due to disagreements between the two nations.

• After a Last-Minute Challenge to New Loss and Damage Deal, U.S. Joins Global Consensus
Ahead of COP28 (Inside Climate News)

The U.S. State Department noted that the U.S. "now welcomes the United Nations guidelines to set up a lass and damage fund, a key issue going into the global COP28 climate talks in Dubai." This comes after the U.S. was hesitant about the agreement's language despite general consensus.

• Global Carbon Emissions are Rising under the Paris Climate Agreement (Politico)

A report out of the United Nations (U.N.) illustrates that "planet-warming pollution is expected to increase 9 percent by the end of the decade under the current climate plans of nearly 200 countries."
