Economic Measures	 Al Hamra Real Estate is cutting cooling charges by up to 20 percent for its tenants in the Bayti villas, the Royal Breeze Residences, the Marina Apartments, the Golf Apartments and Bab al Bahr Residences. (Link)
	 The Emirates Red Crescent has launched the "Among your family" initiative to ease the burdens on housing tenants during the current crisis. (Link)
	• A senior judge has warned UAE companies that they must continue to pay staff their housing allowance if they are made redundant. The ruling is intended to prevent tenants facing an uncertain financial future from being evicted by their landlords. (Link)
	 The UAE's Central Bank is urging banks to support private sector corporates, small to medium enterprises and individuals to mitigate the negative economic effect of the coronavirus. (Link)
	 UAE's Ministry of Economy has reduced fees for 94 services to individuals and companies. The fee reductions are wide ranging but particularly relate to innovation, general business activities, investment, production, trade and import and export. (Link)
