National

• <u>Biden Administration Offers Fewest Offshore Oil and Gas Leases in History</u> (New York Times)

The Biden-Harris administration announced that "oil and gas companies would be able to drill in just three new areas in the Gulf between 2024 and 2029, the smallest number of lease sales offered since the federal drilling program began decades ago."

• White House Defines 'Zero-Emission' Buildings, Hoping More Get Built (Washington Post)

The Biden-Harris administration is slated to define what constitutes a "zero-emission" building, "establishing a new national standard in an effort to tackle one of the biggest contributors to climate change in the United States."

• SEC Chief Says New California Law Could 'Change Baseline' for Coming SEC Climate Rule (Reuters)

Following the passage of a California law requiring companies to disclose climate-related risks, Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) Chair Gary Gensler "highlighted the potential for the California law to support the agency's efforts to regulate corporate climate disclosures."

Peak Oil is Near, Energy Agency Says, But Climate Change is Far From Solved (New York Times)

An International Energy Agency report detailed that "cleaner energy technologies like electric cars and solar panels are spreading so rapidly that the global use of oil, coal, and natural gas could peak this decade, but countries will still need to pursue more aggressive measures if they want to limit global warming to relatively safe levels."

• Shapiro Advisors Endorse Emissions Curbs to Fight Climate Change but Don't Embrace RGGI Membership (Inside Climate News)

Gov. Josh Shapiro's (D-PA) working group on the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) "endorsed participation in a 'cap-and-invest' process to reduce utilities' greenhouse gas emissions but stopped short of endorsing membership in RGGI."

• Gas, Oil Companies Argue Against Oregon's Emissions Deadlines During Court of Appeals Hearing (Oregon Capital Chronicle)

Three natural gas companies in Oregon are "challenging the state Climate Protection Program, the state rules requiring gas companies and major industrial facilities to progressively cut greenhouse gas emissions."

International

 Proposed EU Green Chief Sefcovic: Hopes EU Can Set 90% Target for Emissions Cut by 2040 (Reuters)

The proposed European Union (EU) green deal chief Maros Sefcovic expressed that "he hoped the European Union could set a target to cut emissions by at least 90% by 2040."

• Slow Route to Net Zero Will Worsen Global Climate Crisis, IPCC Chief Warns (The Guardian)

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) cautioned that "postponing action and taking a slower route to net zero emissions by 2050 will worsen the climate crisis even if the goal is still reached by that date."

• International Climate and Energy Summit in Madrid Builds Momentum Behind Efforts to Reach 1.5°C Goal (International Energy Agency)

Senior officials from almost 40 countries and international organizations met for the International Climate and Energy Summit which "sought to build a broad coalition behind efforts to keep the Paris Agreement goal of limiting global warming to 1.5°C within reach."
