Climate Policy Update

Good Evening! This is Akin Gump's <u>weekly policy newsletter</u> on all things **climate change**. Below are the major federal climate policy headlines of the past week:

 President Biden Signs Executive Order to Protect Old-Growth Forests (The New York Times) On Earth Day, Friday, April 22nd, President Joe Biden signed a new <u>executive order</u> to strengthen domestic and international forest protection commitments made in the United States. The order directs the U.S. Department of the Interior and the U.S. Department of Agriculture to partner on a range of conservation strategies to protect forests on federal lands. It also requires federal agencies to develop 2030 targets for reforestation and to compile the first-ever U.S. National Nature Assessment.

<u>Council on Environmental Quality Issues Final Rule on NEPA</u>

On Tuesday, April 19th, the White House Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) published a <u>final rule</u> as part of its efforts to restore provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act's (NEPA) implementing regulations that were changed by the Trump administration. Among other modifications, the final rule restores the prior definitions of "effects" and "reasonable alternatives" that were amended in an attempt to streamline the NEPA review process. The final rule is the first action in a two-phase NEPA reform approach taken by the CEQ.

<u>National Climate Task Force Holds April Meeting</u>

On Monday, April 18th, the National Climate Task Force held its April Meeting and discussed "how the Administration's efforts were aligned with the IPCC's findings — focused on tackling emissions sectorby-sector by deploying record amounts of clean energy; electrifying our cars, trucks, and buses; decarbonizing industrial processes; and phasing down super-polluting HFCs." The Task Force has yet to publish a National Climate Strategy that was announced in November 2021.
