Good evening! This is Akin Gump's <u>weekly policy newsletter</u> on **climate change** policy and regulatory developments, providing information on major climate policy headlines from this past week and forthcoming climate-related events and hearings:

- Climate Law May Undermine Biden Court Win on Oil Leasing (E&E News)
 - On Wednesday, a decision from the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals put a pause on "federal oil and gas leasing designed to give the government time to study the program's contributions to planet-warming emissions."
- Judge Revives Block on Biden Leasing Pause (E&E News)

- A day after the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals created a pathway for President Biden to pause federal and oil gas leasing, Judge Terry Doughty of the Louisiana District Court "barred the Biden administration from pausing new oil and gas leases on federal lands in 13 Republican-led states." The ruling argued that the Biden-Harris administration's pause on lease sales violates the Mineral Leasing Act (MLA) and Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act (OCSLA).
- Red States Decry 'Woke Left' SEC Proposal for ESG Investing (E&E News)
 - Attorney General Patrick Morrisey (R-WV) filed formal comments with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). The comments argued that the agency's proposal—which would oblige firms to prove the validity of its sustainability efforts and goals—violates the Major Questions Doctrine, which was settled in *West Virginia v. EPA*.
- The Emerging Role of a Sustainability Coordinator in Leveraged Finances Transactions (Speaking Sustainability)

 "Sustainability coordinators" have become a prevalent concept in the financial space and the European Loan Market
 Association (LMA) published guidance surrounding the role. The role differs between transaction and lending institutions
 and is tasked with "syndicated loan transaction where the parties intend to structure all or part of the loan as a green,
 social and/or sustainability-linked (GSS) loan or where it is anticipated that a loan might be converted into a GSS loan at
 a later date."
- Expansion of Clean Energy Loans is 'Sleeping Giant' of Climate Bill (New York Times)
 The Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 includes "as much as \$350 billion in additional federal loans and loan guarantees for energy and automotive projects and businesses." The aforementioned funding will be disbursed by the Department of Energy and may "breathe life into futuristic technologies that banks might find too risky to lend to or into projects that

- California Climate Disclosure Bill Advances with Weakened Enforcement (Politico)
 - California's Senate Bill 260 would require private companies that generate at least \$1 billion in annual revenue to "provide annual information on their greenhouse gas emissions." The bill has been amended to "remove explicit penalties for companies failing to report their emissions in a timely fashion." Furthermore, the amended bill compels regulators to consider industry and stakeholder input in determining reporting timelines.
- <u>Colorado River Water Cut Back Except for California</u> (Cal Matters)

The U.S. Bureau of Reclamation announced the "first-ever Level 2a shortage condition for Lake Mead" which triggered limits to Arizona and Nevada's Colorado River water access. However, California remains entitled to over a third of the river's natural flow.
