Economic Measures	 Sharjah has launched a media campaign to highlight role of their 47-point stimulus package. The media campaign aims to increase awareness of the available relief to ensure the stimulus package is appropriately utilized. (Link)
	 The Abu Dhabi Department of Economic Development launched a strategic new digital service that will enable restaurants, tourism and entertainment facilities to apply for a 20 percent refund of the annual rental value of their commercial property. (Link)
	 The Ministry of Human Resources and Emiratization has called on the private sector to consider workers infected with the coronavirus as sick cases entitled to sick leave per federal law. (Link)
	 Over 1,000 firms sign up for DIFC's pension-style savings scheme. The scheme offers a low-cost investment platform for receiving and managing mandatory end-of-service contributions on behalf of employees. (Link)
Health & Safety	 On May 10, the UAE saw 781 new cases (+25.16% from the previous day) of the coronavirus, bringing the total to 18,198 total confirmed cases. (Link)
